Spiritual life is with God and Spiritual death is separation from God.


What makes an abundant life?

As we look at the genealogy in Matthew we can see many names. Many may look at this listing and wonder what one could ever learn from such a list, after all it is just a family tree; however, when we look closer we can not help but be amazed at the people through whom the savior came.


As we look at the genealogy we see the names of Tamar, Rahab, and Ruth. Is it not interesting that our savior would come through these. We read of Tamar in Genesis and how she played the part of a harlot that she might have seed through Judah. We read about Rahab and how she hid the spies in Jericho and most would remember the story of Ruth and her kind words to here mother-in-law Naomi. What a contrast to have these names with Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and David, God can use all kinds of People. We also see through this listing that God fulfilled his promise to Abraham by blessing the whole world through his seed. Additionally we see the prophecy of Christ coming through the line of David and the tribe of Judah. Furthermore, in the first two chapters we see other prophecy's fulfilled; the virgin birth, the birth in the city of Bethlehem, and Christ coming out of Egypt. In just the first two chapters we see these many prophecy's fulfilled.

One great thing we especially need to remember as we study the book of Matthew is the words in the first

chapter verse 23, "They shall call his name Immanuel, meaning, 'God is with us'." He left a beautiful place where we all desire to be someday. He left a place where there is no sorrow or tears, no death, and no decay for a cruel world that contains all of those things - death, pain, suffering, and sorrow. How great a sacrifice our Lord made for us that we might have life in Him. One of the most awesome verses in the Bible is John 1:12 - "He gave the right to become God's Children to everyone who received him, even to the ones who believe on his name" and also I John 3:1, "Behold! How glorious is the love the Father has showered upon us, that we should be called God's children, and we are!". Is it not wonderful that we can be God's children and that Jesus Christ left Heaven, came to earth and suffered that we might have life in Him.
