

A Study of Matthew

Matthew 12:1-50

Lesson 10

Assignment for next Week — Read Matthew 13:1-23 Memory Verse — Matthew 12:50

Many times in Christ ministry he was challenged by the Pharisees for what he was doing. The Pharisees were very strict about observing traditions, and would even uphold their traditions higher than God's law. The Pharisees once asked Jesus if it was lawful to heal on the Sabbath. To point out the Pharisees hypocrisy Christ ask them, would they not help one of their animals if it needed help on the Sabbath. Then he healed a man with a withered hand. Christ made a point to them -- If it was alright for them to help an animal, how much more so would it be to help their brethren. We too need to be careful that we do not let tradition get in the way of us doing that which is right.

When we do something we need to understand why we do it. We need to ask ourselves, is what we are doing tradition or is it a direct command of God. As we learn more about God's will for our lives and study his word we will find occasions were God has specifically told us when or how to do something; however, we also find times when he has not given us a direct command on how He specifically wants us to do something. It is important that we learn to distinguish between the two. We need to seek the Lord with all our heart and learn his word and seek to live as him. Christ said that the Pharisees needed to learn what was meant by the saying, "I desire mercy and not sacrifice." God desires that we serve him. Once the prophet Samuel upbraided King Saul with words stating that to Obey is better than sacrifice. God does not want us to put giving or doing something to or for him in place of obeying him. King Saul had directly disobeyed God by brining back animals from the slaughter of the Amelikites as well as brought back their king. In a similar fashion the Pharisees had disregarded the needs of the brethren and some had even went as far as to say they could not help their parents because they had given to God. Truly to obey is better than sacrifice.

Christ proceeded, after this incident with the Pharisees, to let them know that no man can serve two masters. We cannot love both the world and God. We cannot be both a good and bad tree. Truly, from the heart men speak and if we have a good heart, much good should come from it.

Later in this chapter we find a parable taught by Christ. This parable has a very important lesson for us. The parable is about an unclean spirit that is cast out, and leaves and goes and when it comes back it finds the place clean and unoccupied and returns and makes the man worse. One lesson we can draw from this is that we only have two choices. We can either fill our lives with Christ or if we chose to fill our lives with nothing -- Satan can easily fill our life. We need to seek to fill our lives with the love of God.

The chapter closes with a very memorable event. Christ's mother and brothers seek him and it is told Christ they are seeking him. Then Christ tells the crowd that whosoever does the will of His Heavenly Father is His brother and His sister and His mother. How wonderful to know that we can be a brother or sister of Christ. John put it so beautifully in I John when he said, "Behold! How glorious is the love the Father has showered upon us, that we should be called God's children, and we are!" Questions
