Matthew 14:1-36

Lesson 13

Assignment for next Week — Read Matthew 15:1-39 Memory Verse — Matthew 14:19

Matthew chapter 14 records some very interesting events in Jesus' ministry and teaches us some very basic lessons of human nature. Previously we had learned that John the Baptist was in prison and in the first part of this chapter we learn why John is in prison and of his death. We learn that John had been put in prison for rebuking Herod and his wife of their sinful relationship. Many times people will hurt those who are trying to correct them. Herod knew he was wrong and put John in prison and only his fear of the people kept him from killing John.

It was probably Herod's pride that put John in prison and it was probably his pride that killed John. At Herod's birthday party his wife's daughter danced for him and pleased him. Herod then chose to give her whatever she would ask. The daughter asked for John's head. Surely, pride led Herod to choose to kill John, because Herod did not want to lose face with those with whom he ate.


We need to learn to watch what we say, and learn to admit when we have made a mistake. One sin can quickly lead to another if we will not repent. It always takes more courage to do what is right when one is in the wrong company or has the wrong attitude. We need to make sure that our hearts' desire is to do what is right and not let anything hold us back from doing it. When we choose to make things right, after a mistake, we will find life is more enjoyable and we will have less guilt and pain.

Another thing we can learn is that there are times

when we need to be alone. After Jesus heard of John's death he sought to be alone. We read that Jesus went to a desert place alone. When life's pressures seem to be coming in all around us sometimes we need to seek to be alone. We may just need to think or maybe we need time to pray. Many times when we are pressed with life's greatest problems we would do well to go to our rooms and stop and think and meditate. We may think about the problem or we may think about the blessings God has given us. However, things do not always work as planned and this can be a great trial.

Surely it was tough for Jesus to learn of John's death and to see these people's reactions. Jesus, even though he had sought to be alone, chose to heal the sick and teach the people when they continued to follow him. We need to seek to have Christ's attitude. When things do not go as we would like them to we need to seek to make the best out of the situation. Christ went on to perform a great miracle feeding over 5000 people with just five loaves and two fishes. Many times we can have a great influence on others by how we handle life's tough times. The Lord knew he could find time later to be alone and did so after he had fed the people.

Later Christ came back to his disciples walking on the water. Christ's power was shown in this miracle. When the disciples saw Christ on the water they thought they saw a ghost, but when they heard it was the Lord, Peter asked the Lord to command him to come to him. The Lord answered, "come", and Peter began. Before he came to the Lord, he began to sink because of fear. The Lord then helped Peter and asked him why he had doubted. If we have strong faith, we can overcome fear. Many times we let the storms of life cause us to sink. When we do not realize that the Lord is right there and that everything is in his control -- we cry out, "Lord save us". In whatever we do we need to realize that God is
