Matthew 26:57-27:26

Lesson 25

Assignment for next Week — Read Matthew 27:27-28:20

## Memory Verse — Matthew 27:37-38

When we look at the night Jesus was tried and the following day a number of thoughts will probably come to mind. We see Jesus not answering the accusations brought against him. We see Jesus mocked and abused. We see a crowd that had joyfully praised him with Hosanna to the Son of David, cry "Crucify Him". We see a group of leaders who for spite and envy delivered Christ for the purpose of death. We see one disciple betray Christ and another deny him. These verses evoke different emotions from us and should cause us to think, but most importantly these verses demonstrate Christ's love and divinity. In these verses we see both the fulfillment of prophecy from the Old Testament, the fulfillment of Christ own words to his disciples, and we also see how great God's love for us is in that he would send His Son and allow him to suffer all of those things to redeem us.

We see a number of prophecy's fulfilled. We see Jesus betrayed for thirty pieces of silver(Zec 11:12) and the money returned used to buy a potters field.(Zec 11:13) We see Jesus when he was accused keep silent. (Is 53:7) We see Jesus smitten and spit upon.(Is 50:6) We see Jesus mocked and insulted.(Ps 22:6-8) Also we see Jesus accused by false witnesses.(Ps 27:12). We see that in these few verses there are guite a number of prophecies that Christ fulfilled.

Christ truly was the Son of God. Who else could

have remained quiet to their accusers? Who else could have remained quiet as the people asked for Barabbas instead of Christ? Who else could have taken the reviling, mocking, and cursing and remained silent? Jesus as God's Son knew that these things had to be endured. Jesus as God's son chose to endure these things that He might redeem us. Jesus as God's Son knew what was before for him and knew what was to come was greater than what he was going through. When we read of how our savior was treated we should be moved in our heart that our God would love us so much to allow these things to happen to His Son.

While we feel moved with God's love in that he sent His Son, we probably seem equally moved the opposite direction by the hatred and envy with which the chief priests and elders delivered Jesus. Hatred, envy, and jealousy are some of the worst emotions. One of our prayers should be that we will always have an open heart for the will of the Lord. The priests and elders did not want to know the will of God and did not want to lose their authority and power; however, it was wrong for them to have this attitude. As we daily read God's word we need to keep a spirit which is always saying, "Speak Lord, thy servant heareth." Also we need to keep a spirit that when we are corrected by another we will take their advice and seek to grow from it.

In our lives we are going to face many challenges but if we, like Christ, will think about the joy set before us we can endure. In our lives we will make mistakes, but we need to make sure we have a heart like Peter's that can weep bitterly about it and then change to do better. We need to seek to have hearts that are ready, willing, and seeking the will of God, hearts yearning to know God word. As we live in Christ we should find joy knowing that he died for us and that if we continue to live in him he has promised us a great hope. If Christ could endure all the
